Tennessee Economic and Community Development Commissioner Matt Kisber announced Pennington Seed & Supply of Dyersburg as the winner of a statewide entrepreneurship video competition – "What Makes You an Entrepreneur?" Pennington Seed & Supply will receive a \$500 cash prize in addition to a professional marketing package valued at \$2,000 for the business.
